Here is a brief guide and summary of the EU regulations REACH and BPR.

If you produce ozone not intended to be used as a biocide* and produce less than one ton per year, you do not need to do anything.

If you produce ozone not intended to be used as a biocide and produce more than one ton per year, you need to obtain a "letter of access" to the REACH dossier for ozone.

REACH (Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006) is the European Regulation on Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals. The main aims of REACH are to ensure a high level of protection for human health and the environment, including the promotion of alternative test methods, as well as the free circulation of substances on the internal market and the enhancement of competitiveness and innovation.

If you produce ozone to use as a biocide¹ you need to do three things.

1. Check that your use of ozone is consistent with a product type where ozone is registered.
2. Make sure the company you are buying your ozone system from has access to an active substance dossier.
3. Make sure your ozone system is registered in the BPR product registration².

BPR, The Biocidal Products Regulation (Regulation (EU) 528/2012) concerns the placing on the market and use of biocidal products, which are used to protect humans, animals, materials or articles against harmful organisms like pests or bacteria, by the action of the active substances contained in the biocidal product. This regulation aims to improve the functioning of the biocidal products market in the EU, while ensuring a high level of protection for humans and the environment.
